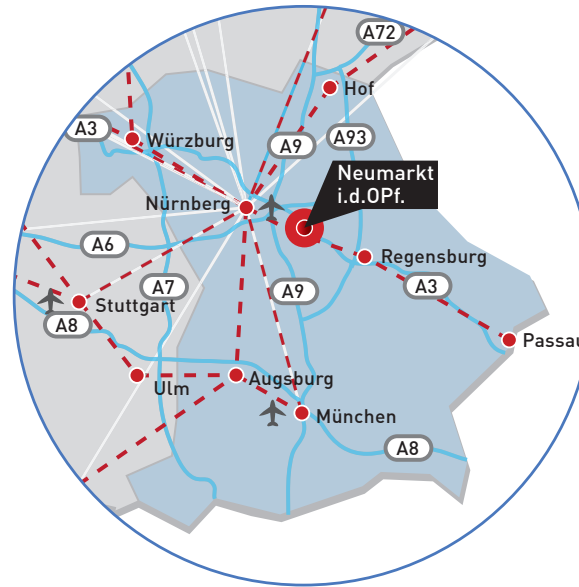

Keen Sights

01 | City Hall

The Late-Gothic city hall was built around 1430, destroyed in 1945, rebuilt in 1956/57, and thoroughly renovated in 1999.



02 | Saint George Fountain

The fountain commemorates the churchyard chapel Saint George (15th century), which was demolished in 1852.



03 | Muenster St. Johannes

The late-gothic hall church (built 1404 – 1434) impresses with its Romanesque baptistery (1230), the Late-Gothic Madonna in the Aureola, the Baroque Corpus Christi as well as the Gothic Plates (1478) in the Chapel of Virgin Mary. The church tower is 72 m (236 ft) high. The church windows were destroyed in 1945 and recreated in 1994.

04 | Former Jewish Synagogue, Hafnergasse 10

The synagogue was dedicated in 1868, on 9 November 1938 defiled, and destroyed in 1945.

05 | Schreiberhaus, Bräugasse

The oldest still intact private townhouse in the city was built around 1430. After thorough renovations, it serves as evidence of bourgeois living and working during the Renaissance around 1610 and of the Late-Baroque beginning in 1760. In 2006, a mikvah, a Jewish ritual bath, was found in the basement and excavated.



Keen Sights

06 | Lower Gate

The earlier Spittler- or Nuremberg Gate was built as part of the town fortification in the 13th century. The tower was removed around 1825. The first reconstruction took place in 1859, which was destroyed in 1945. The Nether Gate as of today was built in 1989/90 and since then serves as a civil registry office with a small assembly hall.



07 | Debtors' Tower

The city jail was located here for some time. In 1945, it was damaged heavily.

08 | Casern Building (1720), Lower Casern Alley

The casern building served as barracks for the Bavarian Chevauleger Regiments from 1814 to 1909.

09 | Palace Ballrooms

The former ballrooms of the palace functioned later as horse stables. After extensive renovation, they are used now to host exhibitions and other events.

10 | Reitstadel

The arsenal (beginning of the 15th century) was burnt down in 1520 and rebuilt between 1531 and 1539. From 1850 to 1909 it was used as an indoor riding hall by the garrison.



In April 1945, it was completely destroyed and rebuilt as a cultural center of the city with an exhibition hall and supra-regionally known concert hall since 1980/81.

11 | Cloister with Gimpturm (Gimpl Tower)

Formerly a small, fortified passage in the city wall leading to the Capuchin cloister, it was expanded into a gate in 1858.

12 | Protestant Lutheran Church

The former church of the Capuchin cloister (1674 – 1677) has been the Protestant parish church since 1855.

Keen Sights

13 | Count Palatine Castle

The Gothic castle was built under Count Palatine Johann between 1430 and 1443 and was burnt down in 1520. The present-day Renaissance building was constructed under Count Palatine Friedrich II in the years 1520 to 1593. It now houses the municipal court.



14 | Hofkirche „Zu Unserer Lieben Frau“

The Late-Gothic Church (around 1418) houses fantastic art treasures such as the marble tomb of Count Palatine Otto II von Mosbach (died 1499), the Stone-Madonna and a statue of Saint Sebastian.

15 | Castle Park

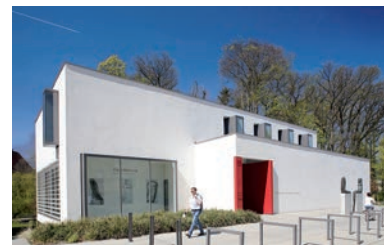
The local recreation center in the heart of the city with the King-Christoph-Fountain is located in the former castle entrenchment.

16 | Castle Pond

The former fish pond of the castle kitchen was turned later into the “ice supplier” of the local breweries.

17 | Museum Lothar Fischer

Since 2004, the oeuvre of the artist Lothar Fischer (1933 – 2004), one of the most influential figurative sculptors of the present, is exhibited in a unique combination of nature, architecture, and art. It is an exciting art forum with three temporary exhibitions per year.



Keen Sights

18 | Neumarkt's Brewery Museum

The museum in the GLOSSNERBRÄU accommodates a rich collection of historic tools and equipment, documenting 14 generations of brewing history, in the midst of the original foundation of the 800-year-old city wall. Afterwards, the GLOSSNER-Keller, Bräustüberl, Hopfenkammerl, and Beer Garden are all suitable for a little welcome rest



19 | Ludwigshain

The recreation area was constructed in the beginning of the 1830s and named after the Bavarian King. In addition, a war memorial for soldiers of the war of 1870/71 is located there

20 | Upper Gate

The tower of today's Sparkasse is reminiscent of the Upper Gate of the town fortification, which was torn down in 1871.



21 | Museum for Historic Maybach Vehicles

On the site of the former Express Bicycle Factory an established, privately owned automobile museum can be found with the worldwide largest exhibition of about

20 historical Maybach vehicles (10% of existing world holdings). The Express Special Exhibition, which was recreated in the style of the factory halls of the late 19th century, invites a visit.

Keen Sights

22 | Bavarian Butcher and Veal Sausage (Weißwurst) Museum

Butcher history comes alive on the 150 m² of the museum. The approximately 150-year-old equipment exemplifies the production process of yesteryears.

23 | City Museum

The museum presents interesting exhibits of Neumarkt's city and industrial history. The collection of bicycles of the heritage brand "Express" is unique.



24 | Arsenal Tower

The tower commemorates the former town fortification.

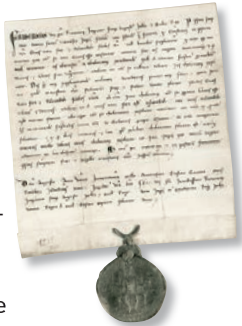

Keen City – Keen City History

Around 1135:

Latest research revealed a “Fridericus de Niuwenmarchte”; however, it has not been certified yet, if our city is meant by this. It was previously assumed that the first mentioning of Neumarkt occurred in a document from 1160 of the cloister Reichenbach, thus serving as founding year of the city. Pivotal for the development of the settlement was the location on the long-distance trading route between Nuremberg and Regensburg. Initiated by the administrative center of the noble House of Hohenstaufen in Berngau, the “new market” was established.



1235:

Neumarkt was first called a city (civitas) in a charter of Emperor Friedrich II from 1235, in which the inhabitants of Neumarkt receive the same mercantile law as their neighbors, from Nuremberg

1269:

As inheritance of the last heir of the House of Hohenstaufen Conradin, Neumarkt is inherited by the House of Wittelsbach.

1329:

The Duchy of Wittelsbach is divided into a Bavarian and a Palatinate Line. Neumarkt and the greater part of the Upperpalatinate belong to the Electoral Palatinate, which is composed of the “Rhine-Palatinate” and the “Upper-Palatinate”.

1410:

Under Count Palatinate Johann (1383 – 1443), Neumarkt is turned into a residence city of a partial principality. An economically strong middle class initiates the constructions of the Late-Gothic Town Parish Church St. Johannes as well as of a sizable town hall.

1520:

Until 1544, Count Palatinate Friedrich II establishes Neumarkt as an regency and administration center for the entire Upperpalatinate. Glamorous court life comes to Neumarkt in the enhanced castle with its church (Hofkirche) and arsenal (Reitstadel).

Keen City – Keen City History

1628:

The Upper Palatinate becomes a part of the Duchy of Bavaria. Neumarkt evolves into an unimportant rural town. Not until the 19th century, does this change.

1843

The Ludwig Canal (Ludwig-Donau-Main-Kanal) turns Neumarkt into a harbor city.

1871:

The connection to the Bavarian railway system in 1871 brings the industrial age to Neumarkt.

19 April 1945:

American air raids almost completely destroy the Medieval city center. The reconstruction is quick and recreates the historical cityscape.

1972:

Through local government reform, Neumarkt loses its municipal immediacy. The townships of Helena, Holzheim, Labersricht, Lippertshofen, Mühlen, Pelchenhofen, Pölling, Stauf, and Woffenbach are integrated into the city of Neumarkt.

1998:

The city organises the 8th Bavarian Landesgartenschau. Until today the area is an attractive local recreation and park area in the city.

2010:

Neumarkt celebrates its 850th city anniversary.

Today, Neumarkt is an independent, self-assured, economic, and cultural center with a high standard of living, which continues through sustainable, environmentally aware political actions.

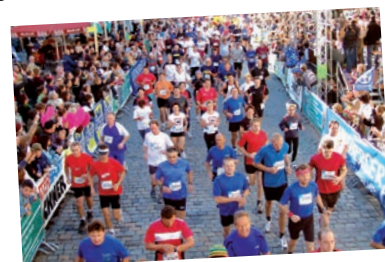
